## CONCEPTUAL PLAN For Area Around the House and New Barn

### Key Features of the Plan

- 1 Front shrub border more heavily planted as lilac hedge
- 2 Existing trees to remain
- 3 Existing entrance incorporated into circular drive
- 4 Stone steps and path to new basement entrance
- 5 Informal pathway between entrances on north face of dwelling
- 6 Existing garage and lean-to
- 7 Existing house
- 8 Proposed addition and covered porch
- 9 Path and steps to new barn structure
- 10 Golf tee for "front three" and "back nine"
- 11 Dry stone retaining walls and planted terraces
- 12 Proposed new barn structure
- 13 Planted patio and "ruins" garden in old foundation
- 14 Alignment of eventual pathway subject to determination by use
- 15 Golf green #1
- 16 Tee for hole #2
- 17 Pathway meanders through existing grove of trees
- 18 Gateway to the back lane
- 19 Rear patio/deck extended along south side of addition
- 20 Upper terrace to be primarily lawn, with inserted paving stones
- 21 Terraced gardens created behind dry stone retaining walls
- 22 Golf green #2 double as fine lawn area
- 23 Existing garden at the well
- 24 Lower gate to back lane
- 25 Tee for hole #3
- 26 Additional flowering trees and shrubs planted as hedgerow
- 27 Mown pathway in field out to the "boulder grove"
- 28 Semi circular sweep of lawn
- 29 Small lawn enclosure and bench, focused on existing apple tree
- 30 Overhead arbour aligns with main steps off deck and gazebo
- 31 Elliptical fine lawn doubles as Green #3
- 32 Optional sand trap with boulders. Doubles as "Zen garden"
- 33 Gazebo lawn/garden. Rail fence relocated to include prime tree
- 34 Informal bark mulch pathway through new landforms
- 35 Subtle drainage swale
- 36 Topsoil berms created for privacy planting. See Detail Plan
- 37 Rustic trellis as passage through existing cedars and into berm area, developed as natural habitat buffer
